Launched in 2016 with the support of celebrities such as Ed Sheeran, James Cordon and Rizzle Kicks, the I AM WHOLE campaign was set up by the YMCA to challenge the stigma surrounding Mental Health issues and provide support for those that suffer.

Daniel Ritchie, Year 14, through his work with YMCA was selected to be interviewed by actor Jody Latham (*Shameless*) in a video to promote the campaign. Daniel commented on this, "It was incredibly encouraging to speak about my experiences in the hope that my testimony can help those who fall victim to mental health problems."

Daniel also attended an event at Stormont to celebrate the launch of the I AM WHOLE campaign. He spoke in front of politicians including Arlene Foster to push for better societal attitude towards Mental Health.



Miss Lemon, Daniel's Head of Year commented, "It is a privilege to watch all of our pupils grow and develop from when they join us in Year 8 to when they leave in Year 14. Daniel is a great example and role model of how to navigate life's ups and downs as a young person. Talking about mental health and getting support is crucial."

Man of the Match:


